Reed is now in his 13th year at Novell. In August Reed was assigned to the team working on Novell's new thrust into the Linux marketplace that has been a welcome change.

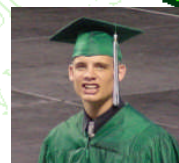
